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## **START UP GUIDE COMPLETED**

SALT LAKE CITY, UT - A guide showing how to start a One World Everybody Eats - like community kitchen has been produced and distributed by the Salt Lake City based, no menu, no prices eatery.

The non-profit has received more than four dozen requests from individuals around the United States expressing a desire to recreate the altruistic, price-your-own-meal entity. In an effort to meet the need and help spread the community building endeavor, the board and staff have created "Spirit in Business - A Guide to Starting a Community Kitchen."

One World Everybody Eats began in 2003 as One World Cafe. Owner Denise Cerreta was inspired to go to a non-profit format in 2005, and the establishment received its tax exemption status in December 2006. Ms. Cerreta started One World Cafe with the belief that people are basically honest and don't want to be forced to overeat, or waste food and money. The goal of the organization is to establish other community kitchens in other cities around the country. It has received national attention for its concept and promotes the idea the it can be easily duplicated anywhere with the same, positive results.
